Maersk Oil and Gas history

1962 Establishment of the Dansk Undergrunds Consortium (DUC) and awarded the concession for the Danish North Sea
1966 First discovery in the Danish North Sea at the Kraka field

1972 First oil production in the Danish North Sea, the Dan field

1984 First gas from exports from a Danish field, Tyra
